STANFORD UNIVERSITY

Stanford finished in second place behind the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars Saturday at the Pacific Coast Collegiate Classic at the Oakland Convention Center.

Second-ranked California finished in third, followed by No. 4 Michigan, No. 6 Illinois, No. 14 Air Force and No. 5 Minnesota.

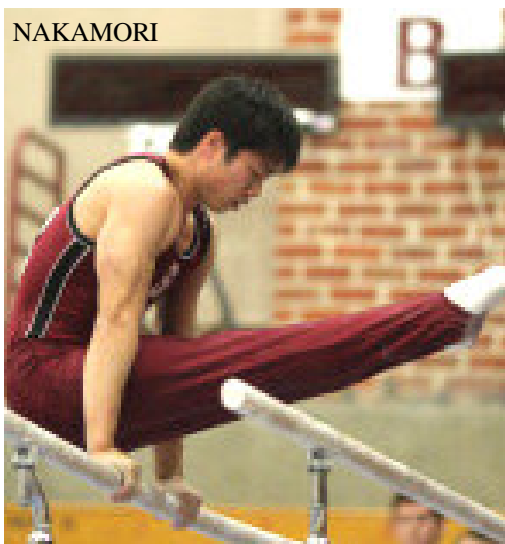
On floor exercise, Stanford showed why it was the nation's best in the event, scoring the highest total of the night (60.8) out of any team, paced by Josh Dixon's 15.5 performance, which was good enough for first place. Greg Ter-Zakhariants took third with a 15.4.

The Cardinal also posted at 58.65 on pommel horse, eclipsing its previous season-best of 54.35, which it earned at last weekend's Gold Country Classic. All four counting scores at least scored a 14, with Bryant Hadden leading the way at 14.85, a new team individual season-best.

On still rings, Stanford also earned another team season-high total of 60.85, also the best cumulative score for any team on the night.

Three athletes hit no less than 15.0, and again Hadden led the way with a 15.65, yet another team individual season-high and event title. Nick Noone also hit a career-high on 15.1 on the apparatus.

On vault, Ter-Zakhariants took second place with a 16.0, and all three other competitors for the Cardinal were solid as well, posting a team total of 62.8.

On parallel bars Sho Nakamori improved upon his season-best, scoring a 15.55, which also gave him the event title on the evening. Ryan Lieberman tallied the best all-around performance for Stanford with an 82.5.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

California men's gymnastics team took third at the Pacific Coast Classic at the Oakland Convention Center on Saturday night. The Golden Bears finished ahead of No. 4 Michigan, No. 6 Illinois, No. 14 Air Force, and No. 5 Minnesota, but behind No. 3 Stanford (second), and a team of Japanese all-stars (first).

Freshman Glen Ishino took second in the all-around out of 77 gymnasts competing with a

89.600. He won pommel horse with a 15.200 for his highest individual event finish of the night. Kyle Bunthuwong finished third all-around at 88.950. He also took fourth place on high bar with a 14.950.

Kyson Bunthuwong finished second on two events - floor (15.450) and high bar (15.050). He was 13th in the all-around at 73.550. Evan Roth took second on still rings with a 15.400.

UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma claimed all six event titles en route to its fourth straight victory with a victory over No. 10 Iowa on "Cleveland Elementary Night" Saturday at the Howard McCasland Field House. The Sooners scored a 354.25 to beat the Hawkeyes (336.00) in front of 779 fans.

OU started strong with a season high team score of 60.65 on floor exercise, as Steven Legendre claimed the event title with a career high 15.65. Russell Czeschin also posted a career-high score of 15.15, coming in second on the event.

Oklahoma extended its lead by claiming its second event title with a season high 57.05 on pommel horse. Jacob Messina captured the event title with a career high score 14.80 and

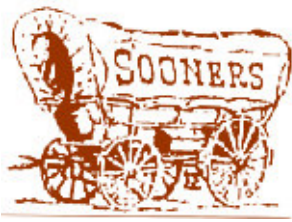
Corey English finished second with a career-high score of 14.75.

well.”

The Sooners claimed the vault title with a score of 64.00. Russell Czeschin won the individual title by posting a career-high score of

16.10, while Bobby Shortle tallied a career high as well with a score of 16.00.

On parallel bars, the Sooners added another career high from Jacob Messina with a score of 14.90. It was Messina’s second career-high mark of the night.

The sweep of the meet was completed on high bar with a team event score of 56.40 and a career score coming from Steven Legendre (15.15).

AIR FORCE ACADEMY

Highlighted by a fifth-place finish on the still rings from Jake Schonig, Air Force concluded competition at the prestigious Pacific Coast Classic on Saturday, Feb. 21, in Oakland, Calif. Schonig posted a season-best score of 15.200 for the Falcons' highest



placement of the night. Air Force tallied a team score of 324.50 to finish sixth.

The 2009 Pacific Coast Classic featured five of the top six teams in the nation, as well as members of the Japan Collegiate All-Star team.

Nash Mills picked up an 11th-place finish in the all-around. Mills' best finish of the night came on the vault, as he scored a 14.80. Mills' vault score - the third-highest of his career - is tied for the 16th-best in Academy history.

David Menefee had a strong night, tallying career-best scores in three of the four events he competed in. The freshman improved his personal-high marks on the floor (13.25) and still rings (14.00), while debuting on the vault with a score of 14.60. In his first collegiate vault, Menefee moved into 20th on the program's all-time list.

Several Falcons finished among near the

top half of the standings in their respective events. Aaron Zaiser finished 24th on the floor exercise with a score of 14.45, while Josiah Loeser earned that same placement on the still rings with a mark of 14.40. Zaiser's floor mark is tied for the 12th-best in program history.

ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

The Sun Devil club team also participated in the Pacific Coast Classic and their top scorers were:

Alex Gaudaur: AA-79.60, FX-13.60, PH-12.50, SR-13.95, V-14.75, PB-12.70, and HB-12.10. Riley Barclay: AA-74.75, FX: 13.00, PH-14.10, SR: 11.55, V: 13.20, PB: 12.05, and HB-12.15. Brandon Dibold entered 4 events: PH-12.30, SR-13.85, V-14.85, and PB-12.90.
