Stanford completed its regular season with a big win over Illinois-Chicago on Friday night in the Windy City. The Cardinal won on all six apparatus easily defeating the Flames, 360.0-342.6. Stanford's depth was on display as a different Cardinal gymnast won each event.

The Cardinal fell to No. 2 in the nation based on the National Rankings earlier in the week, despite defeating the new No. 1, Oklahoma, just two weeks ago. The Cardinal are undefeated against collegiate teams this season.

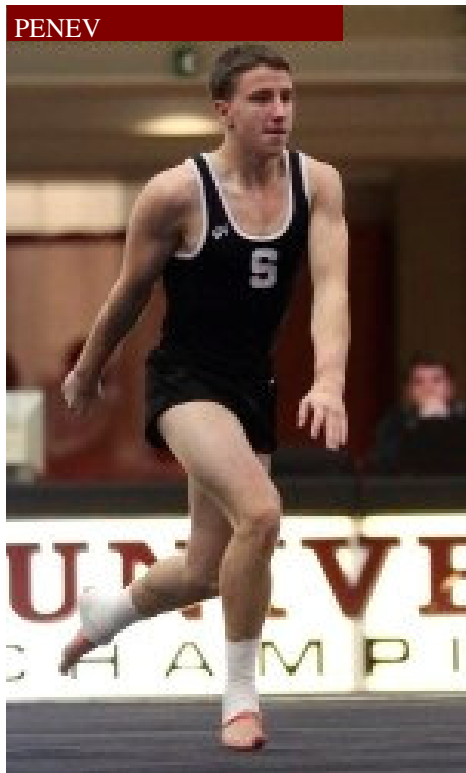
The top scores of the day for Stanford came on vault. Eddie Penev led the Cardinal with a score of 16.3 to help Stanford to a team score

score of 14.45. Eric Hergenrader also added a score of 14.35 as the Cardinal scored a 57.2.
