

UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma remained undefeated in 2011 on Saturday after defeating Minnesota and Team Texas at the McCasland Field House. A season-best 1,098 fans watched OU (5-0 overall, 2-0 MPSF) post a 344.650 en route to the victory over the Gophers (336.75) and Team Texas (293.40).

"I am pleased with the crowd support and it's great to hear them respond to good gymnastics," said OU Head Coach Mark Williams. "Steve caught three high bar release moves in a row, the crowd cheered and that gets really fun."

The Sooners claimed five of the six team events on floor (56.75), rings (59.10), vault (63.70), parallel bars (55.15) and high bar (56.00). The Sooners have only lost two event titles this season, both on pommel horse (Saturday and at the Rocky Mountain Open).

Alex Naddour claimed his first all-around of the season with a score of 83.25. The Sooners posted top scores on five of the six individual events with three different gymnasts winning titles.

"We started slowly and tried to give some opportunities to guys to get out there and compete," added Williams. "We are definitely not in the same position that we were in last weekend."

Jacob Dalton won three events on floor (15.05), vault (16.55) and high bar (14.45). For the second straight week, Dalton tied the program record on vault with a score of 16.55.

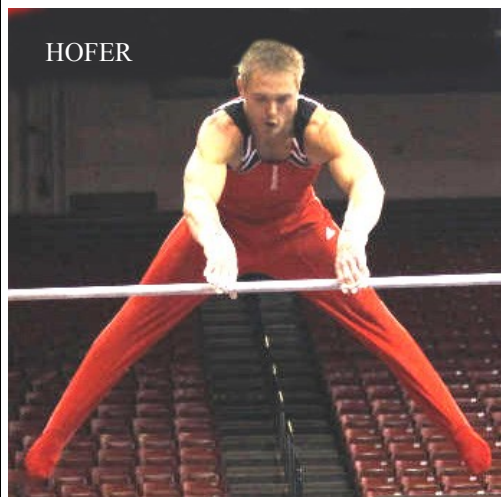
Chris Stehl claimed his first career individual title on parallel bars with a 14.050, while Troy Nitzky finished with the night's top score on rings (15.35).

UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

Nebraska topped Air Force 343.00-334.40 at the Bob Devaney Sports Center Sunday.

Four Huskers captured individual event crowns on the afternoon, helping Nebraska

notch a season-high 343.00 team total. Andreas Hofer led NU's hardware haul with his first three titles of the season. Hofer won the individual all-around crown with a season-high 85.45, which included victories on floor exercise (14.75) and high bar (14.45).

Anthony Ingrelli claimed his second straight title with a 14.45 on still rings. Freshman Eric Schryver captured the event title of his career with a 14.90 on pommel horse, while Bear Danley added a parallel bars crown with a 14.50.

Air Force's Ben Zaiser claimed the Falcon's lone event win of the day on vault with a 15.60.

Nebraska started the day on floor, where they totaled a 57.10, including Hofer's 14.75 to win the event. NU moved to pommel horse where Schryver's career-high 14.90 led NU to a 54.45 event score, while fellow freshman Wyatt Aycock added a career-high 14.15 on the event on his way to a career-high 83.40 in his first career all-around competition.

On still rings, Ingrelli's 14.45 won the event, while Donovan Arndt added a career-high 14.25. NU then notched its top event score of the day with a 61.80 on vault, led by Andrew House's career-best 15.55 on the event. Hofer pitched in a 15.45, while Will Eastman and C.J. Schaaf both contributed scores of 15.40. All six Huskers scored at least 15.25 on the event, including Aycock's career-best 15.30.

Danley led Nebraska's 56.90 team score on parallel bars with his 14.50 individual total. Aycock added a solid 14.300, while Hofer contributed a 14.15 and Schaaf pitched in a career-high 13.95.

The Huskers closed out the victory with a 56.90 on high bar, led by Hofer's 14.45. Dan-

ley and Mark Ringle each contributed scores of 14.25 on the event, which Schaaf added a career-best 13.95.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY

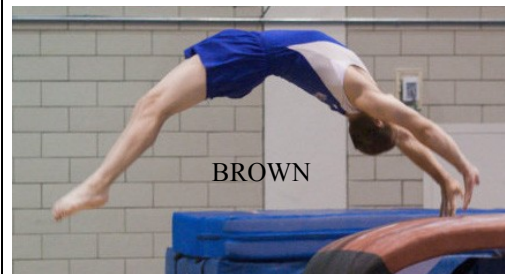
Highlighted by a first-place finish on the vault from freshman Ben Zaiser, Air Force posted its highest score of the season (334.40) in a dual meet against Nebraska (343.00) on Sunday, Jan. 30, in Lincoln, Neb. It is the second straight week that the Falcons have improved their season total by three points.

Zaiser, competing in his first collegiate meet, posted a 15.60 to win the vault. That score, the Falcons' second-highest score of the season, is tied for the eighth-best score in Academy history. Zaiser was one of four Falcons to cross the 15-point mark on that apparatus, as Nash Mills and Tory Brown tallied matching marks of 15.20 and Aaron Zaiser added a score of 15.00.

James Okamoto was the runner-up on the pommel horse, posting a season-best score of 14.60. That score, the best on the team to date, is the second-highest of Okamoto's career and the fifth-best total in program history. Freshman Patrick Duffy finished fourth on

that event with a score of 13.65.



The Falcons also claimed a pair of top-four finishes on the still rings. Dan Klimkowski paced the team with a third-place score of 13.90, while Devin Manefee and Mills tied for fourth with matching scores of 13.75.

Air Force picked up two top-six finishes on the parallel bars, following career-best performances from freshman Colton Wulf and Matt Thorne. In his first collegiate performance on that event, Wulf finished fifth with the team's highest score of the season at 13.90. Both Wulf and Thorne, who finished sixth with a career-high tally of 13.85, moved up the program's records, posting the 15th- and 16th-highest scores, respectively, in Academy history.

Mills finished third on the high bar, with a season-best score of 14.10 - the Falcon's highest score to date on that event, while Wulf paced the Falcons on the floor exercise, with a team-leading score of 14.35.
