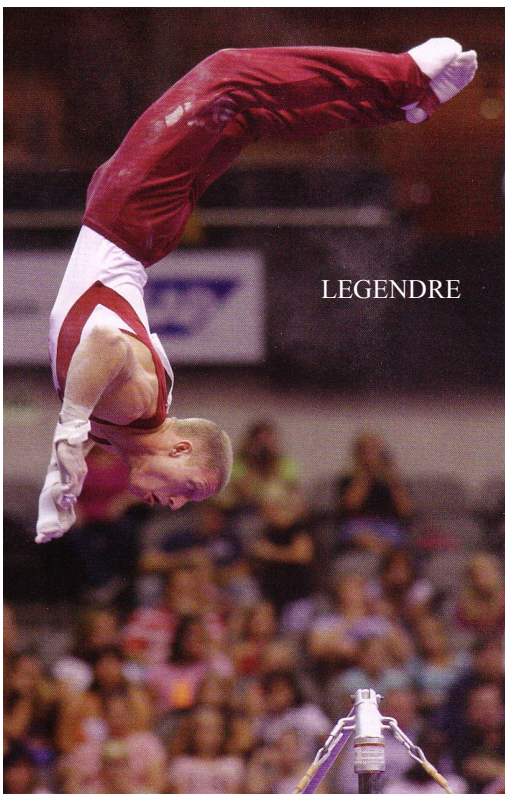
Fourth-ranked Oklahoma remained undefeated on the season downing No. 9 Nebraska and No. 13 Illinois Chicago on Sunday, Feb. 13. The Sooners posted its highest team total of the season (360.60) en route to their victory over the Huskers (349.70) and Flames (332.50).

OU swept each of the team events on floor (60.60), pommel horse (57.90), rings (59.40), vault (64.50), parallel bars (59.50) and high bar (58.70). The Sooners last swept each of the event titles against Ohio State on Jan 22.

The Sooners recorded season highs on pommel horse, high bar, parallel bars and vault while Steven Legendre won his first all-around of the season with a score of 92.20.

Legendre, a six-time NCAA National Champion, also claimed three individual event titles on floor (16.20), high bar (15.00) and with a program-record 16.70 on vault. The record was previously held by Jacob Dalton (16.55), set earlier this year on Jan. 29.

In addition, Oklahoma swept each of the individual events for the first time this year with four different gymnasts claiming titles. Legendre led the Sooners with three event victories (floor, vault and high bar), Ian Jackson tied for first on rings (15.20), Alex Nadour claimed the pommel horse (15.40) and Jacob Dalton won on parallel bars (15.10).



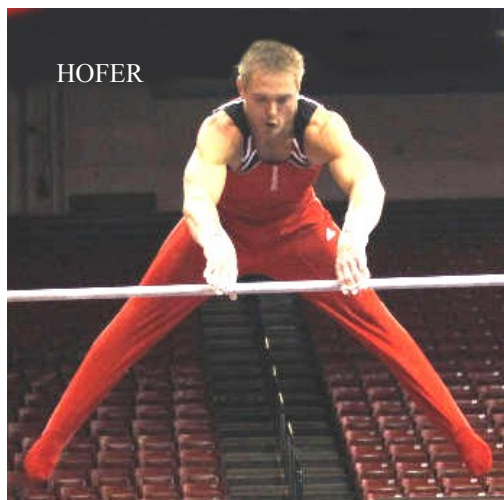

UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

The No. 10 Nebraska men's gymnastics team came in second against No. 4 Oklahoma and No. 13 University of Illinois-Chicago Sunday afternoon at the Devaney Center. The Huskers posted a score of 349.70, behind OU's 360.60 and ahead of UIC's 332.50.

This was the 2nd highest team score for UN in the past two years.

Andreas Hofer tied for second in the all-around standings, scoring an 85.20.

On FX the Huskers were led by Andreas Hofer as he scored a 15.10. He earned a second-place finish on the event. Will Eastman and Wyatt Aycock both received a 14.70, a career-best for Aycock, Mark Ringle hit a career-high 14.60.

The Huskers moved to pommel horse where Eric Schryver continued to impress and scored a career-high 15.30. Hofer tallied a 14.10, and junior David Jacobs posted a career-high 14.00. Aycock added a 13.70, while NU posted a 57.10 on the event.

Nebraska moved to rings where Ingrelli scored a 15.20 and tied for first-place in the event. Donovan Arndt posted a 14.80 and Hofer hit a 14.30. Schryver contributed a 13.50 as the Huskers tabbed a 57.80 rings total.

The Huskers headed to vault where they posted their highest team score of the day with a 62.70. NU was led by Hofer, who tied a career high by scoring a 15.90. Eastman earned a 15.70, C.J. Schaaf added a career-high 15.60 and Ringle hit a career-high 15.50.

On parallel bar Ringle led the team and hit a career-high 14.100. Schaaf earned a career-high 14.00, while Bear Danley notched a 13.90. Aycock posted a 13.80, giving the Huskers an event score of 55.80.

Nebraska closed the afternoon on high bar, where Danley came in third with a 14.50. Ringle scored a career-best 14.40 and Schryver earned a score of 14.20. Jacobs contributed a 14.10, while NU notched a 57.20 on the event.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Thanks to an all-around title-winning performance from sophomore Donothan Bailey (no score provided), No. 2 California upset No. 1 Stanford, 343.30-339.70, on Saturday evening at the Gold Country Classic.

As a team, Cal won floor, vault, parallel bars and high bar to completely overpower the Cardinal.

Nic Blair took home the pommel-horse title with a 15.20. On rings, it was Steven La-combe scoring a 15.10 to win the event.

Vault saw Christian Monteclaro win thanks to this 15.90. In addition to his all-around title, Bailey also won high bar (15.10).

The all-arounders that Cal normally looks to for high scores - Bryan del Castillo, Glen Ishino and Dennis Mannhart - did not compete. No other information available.
