## UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

Steven Legendre claimed the all-around with a score of 89.25, as the second-ranked Oklahoma men's gymnastics team defeated sixth-ranked Michigan on Saturday.

OU moves to 10-0 on the season, as the Sooners scored a 357.75 to beat the defending NCAA National Champions (355.40) in their first meeting of the regular season.

The win marks the second straight victory over the Wolverines at Cliff Keen Arena, as Oklahoma claimed its eighth victory of a top 10 opponent.

OU won five out of six events each of the team event on floor (59.40), pommel horse (58.60), rings (59.35), vault (63.10) and parallel bars (59.45).

Highlighting the meet for Oklahoma was Legendre winning his second straight all-around, which was the 12th of his career. Legendre claimed an individual event title on vault with a score of 16.05.



Alex Naddour also took his fourth pommel horse title of the season with a score of 15.65.

Jacob Dalton, fresh off his American Cup third-place finish, posted a top scores on floor (15.35), rings (15.10) to take two individual titles.

## UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

For the first time all year, No. 3 California won all six events, giving the Golden Bears a 353.35-336.95 win over No. 10 Iowa on Saturday evening.

Dennis Mannhart won the all-around title with an 86.50 in front of the 545 fans in attendance at Haas Pavilion.

Also having a stellar night was Kyle Bunthuwong, who won three events - pommel horse, parallel bars and high bar.

Cal notched a 57.40 on floor thanks to Daniel Culpepper's first-place finish of 14.90. Bryan del Castillo took third overall and second amongst the Bears with his 14.35. Dennis Mannhart was fourth (14.20) and Jean

Monteclaro tied for fifth (13.95).

Kyle Bunthuwong's 15.25 easily won the pommel horse event. Nic Blair was fourth



with a 14.25 and Matthew del Junco and Donothan Bailey tied for sixth with a 14.15.

Jeffrey Langenstein paced the Bears and all competitors on vault with a 16.25, Jean Monteclaro in third (16.05), Mannhart fourth (15.70) and Christian Monteclaro finishing fifth (15.60).

The Bears took the first three spots on rings with Steven Lacombe finishing first with a 14.95. Next in line was Kyle Bunthuwong with a 14.40 followed by Mannhart with a 14.05. Christian Monteclaro (13.60) and Jean Monteclaro (13.55) rounded out the Cal contributors.

Cal's top four finishers were also the top four contestants on parallel bars with Bunthuwong leading the way with this first place score of 15.20. Daniel Geri finished second (14.95), James Kerry (14.65) and Eric Haeussler tied Lance Alberhasky for fourth (14.15).

Bunthuwong led the way on high bar, outscoring the closest competitor by over a full point with a 15.60 to close the meet. Haeussler was next in line with a 14.45 for second and Mannhart took third at 14.25. Jacob Jizrawi got on the board with a 14.20 for fourth place.

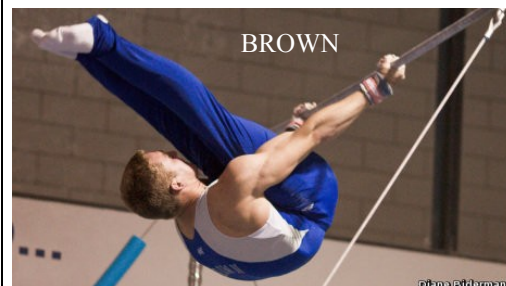
## AIR FORCE ACADEMY-3-11-11

Highlighted by the top four scores on the high bar, the 11th-ranked Air Force men's gymnastics team set a new Academy record on that event during competition at the Brockport Triangular on Friday, March 11, in Brockport, N.Y. Air Force combined for a team high bar score of 57.40 to shatter the previous mark by nearly a point.

Air Force posted its third-highest score of

the season (341.40) to finish second in the three-team meet. In addition to being the third-best score of the season, that total is also the seventh highest score in Academy history. Minnesota, ranked eighth in the nation, won the meet with a total of 347.40, while Brockport finished third at 299.50.

The Falcons shined on the high bar, tallying a program-record team score of 57.40 as all four scoring gymnasts scored above 14.10. That mark shattered the previous record (56.50) that was set last year. Tory Brown and freshman Colton Wulf tied for the team lead with matching career-best marks of 14.50 -



the fourth-highest individual scores in Academy history. Nash Mills, who set the program record last week, was the runner-up with a score of 14.30, while freshman Mac Ritchie recorded a personal-best score of 14.10 to tie for third. In addition, James Okamoto took fourth with a career-best score of 14.00.

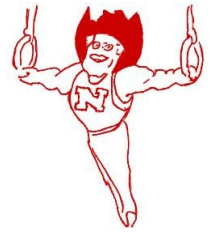
Air Force recorded two additional first-place scores.

Matt Throne tied for first on the parallel bars with a career-best tally of 14.30 - the eighth-best score in program history. Wulf tied for third (14.10), while Mills and Dan Klimkowski placed fourth (13.90) and fifth (13.70), respectively.

Devin Menefee matched his season-high mark on the still rings, scoring a 14.80 to win that event. Mills tied for second with a score of 14.70, while Ritchie finished among the top six with a career-best tally of 13.90.

In addition to his share of the win on the high bar, Brown was the Falcons' top finisher on the floor exercise and vault. Brown finished third on the floor (14.40), while tying for third on the vault (15.60) with freshman Ben Zaiser.

Air Force also earned top-six finishes on the floor from Wulf and Klimkowski, who finished fourth (14.30) and sixth (14.10), respectively. Wulf also picked up a top-five score on the vault, tying with Mills for fifth behind matching marks of 15.30.

Freshman Patrick Duffy and Nick Owen rounded out the Falcons' event leaders, as the pair tied for third on the pommel horse with scores of 13.30.

### AIR FORCE ACADEMY-3-13-11

With the third-highest team score in Academy history, 11th-ranked Air Force easily won a triangular meet at Springfield College on Sunday, March 13. With four individual titles, the Falcons captured a total of 343.30 to win the team title over No. 14 William and Mary (338.80) and No. 15 Springfield (330.00).

Nash Mills captured a pair of event titles, winning the parallel bars and high bar. Mills scored a season-best 14.70 to win the parallel bars, while posting a 14.80 to take first on the high bar.

While Mills was the only Falcon to finish among the top six on the parallel bars, he paced Air Force to four of the top five spots on the high bar.

Freshman Colton Wulf recorded a career-best score of 14.60 to finish second, while classmate Mac Ritchie used a personal-best score of 14.40 to take fourth. James Okamoto rounded out the squad's top-five finishers on that event with a career-high 14.00 to place fifth. Mills' score was just .100 off of his Academy record score that he set last weekend, while Wulf and Ritchie respectively posted the third- and fourth-highest totals in program history.

Tory Brown won the vault with a career-best matching score of 15.90, while Mills and freshman Ben Zaiser tied for fourth with matching marks of 15.60. Zaiser's score matched his career-high for the third time this season. Nick Owen rounded out the Falcons'

first-place finishes, as he won the pommel horse with a score of 13.90. Freshman Patrick Duffy placed third on that event with a score of 13.50.

Air Force also accounted for four of top six scores on the still rings and three of the top six marks on the floor exercise. Mills was the runner-up on the still rings with a career-best 14.90, while Devin Menefee took third with a score of 14.70. Freshman Tyler Huebner scored a personal-best 14.30 to tie for fourth.

Aaron Zaiser paced the Falcons on the floor exercise, with a third-place score of 14.40. Brown tied for fourth behind a career-best score of 14.30, while Wulf tied for sixth with a mark of 14.20. Wulf was the runner-up in the all-around with a career-best total of 84.10.

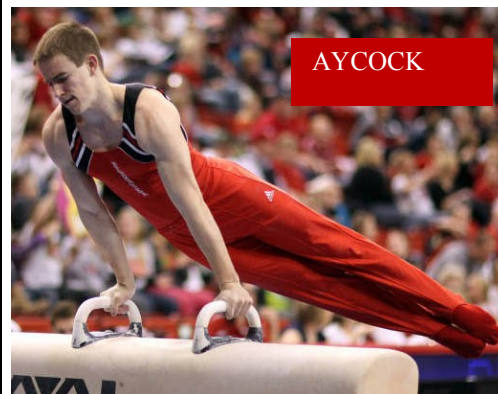
### UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

The No. 7 Nebraska Cornhuskers traveled to Columbus for a triangular meet against No. 4 Illinois and No. 9 Ohio State where the Huskers took third place scoring a 334.55 behind Ohio State's 350.35 and Illinois' 346.35.

Nebraska started the night out on rings where freshman C.J. Schaaf (13.90), Eric Schryver (14.10) and Wyatt Aycock (14.30) all tallied career highs.

Next the Huskers moved to floor where junior Will Eastman led the way for the Huskers with a 14.55.

On pommel horse, the Huskers were led by freshman Aycock and Schryver who both scored a team high 13.40.

For the fourth rotation, the Huskers moved to high bar where Andreas Hofer earned the top score for the Huskers with a 13.95. Other top performers for the Huskers were junior David Jacobs and senior Bear Danley both scoring a 13.90.

The Husker vault team was led by fresh-

man, Andrew House with a 15.30. Freshman Schaaf(15.15) and Aycock(15.05) were also key contributors on vault.

The Huskers finished the night out on parallel bars where Hofer notched a season high, 14.70 and captured the event title. Aycock and Schryver also had solid performances on parallel bars scoring a 14.30 and 14.15 respectively.

Aycock earned his first all-around title on Saturday night by posting a career high, 84.40. Aycock scored a 13.85 on floor, 13.40 on pommel horse, 14.20 on rings, 15.05 on vault, 14.30 on parallel bars and 13.60 on high bar. Hofer also completed all around posting an 81.05.

### ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY-3-5-11

Arizona State traveled to Seattle, WA for the first time in three years to compete against PAC-10 rival University of Washington Huskies. It was the first time in over 30 years that the UW Men & Women had a home dual meet together on the same floor and it went off without a hitch. A very enthusiastic crowd enjoyed 2 hours of high level NCAA competition with both men and women gymnasts vying for team and individual honors.

In spite of a rough start, ASU took top honors in all individual events. The team started rough on Pommel Horse with only one Sun Devil (Alex Gaudaur) hitting a solid routine.

Having to dig out of the hole, the team hit floor slightly better with a few bobbles that saw the Huskies on their tail. On Rings, ASU came back very strong hitting all six of their routines and taking a strong team lead. On Vault, the Huskies hung right with ASU as both teams had four solid team scores to count.

Event winners were scattered amongst the ASU team with Senior Cody Payne winning Rings and High Bar. Sophomore Lee Wilkerson took Floor honors while Junior Alex Gaudaur won Pommel Horse. Senior Josh Bradley won Vault and Freshman Kyle Nakashima hit clean taking first place on P Bars.
