**UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA**

No. 2 Oklahoma capped off another undefeated regular season with a pair of wins over No. 4 Illinois and No. 5 Penn State at the Howard McCasland Field House on Saturday.

The Sooners posted the highest score in the NCAA this season (366.40) en route to its victory over the Fighting Illini (359.10) and the Nittany Lions (356.75).

Oklahoma finished the regular season undefeated for the fourth time under Williams. The Sooners have finished the regular season undefeated four times in the past seven years (2011, 2009, 2006, 2004).

In addition, the Sooners are 19-0 at Howard McCasland Field House since its last home loss in 2007 to Ohio State.

On Saturday, Oklahoma posted top scores on four of the six event titles with team highs on floor (62.85), vault (64.90), parallel bars (59.15) and high bar (59.30). OU also broke a team program record on vault with a 64.90, previously set against Penn State in 2009 (64.65).

Highlighting the meet was Jacob Dalton, who tied an individual program record on vault with a 16.70, previously held by senior Steven Legendre.

Legendre made his presence felt as he claimed the all-around with a 91.25, while

also tying for first on high bar with a 15.35.

“We are still seeing improvements each meet and some of the little things in practice that we are working on are starting to show,” continued Williams. “The guys had great energy and it was a big night. The way things are going, I could see us contending for a national title.”

**UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA**

Nebraska's No. 8 men's gymnastics team celebrated Senior Night with a win over No. 9 Minnesota and No.11 Iowa Saturday night at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

The Huskers earned four event titles and posted the best team score of the past two years in the win. Nebraska's 354.500 topped Iowa's 351.800 and Minnesota's 348.600. The Huskers also earned 14 career highs in the season finale.

Nebraska's score is also approximately 11 points higher than they scored in the NCAA Championships of 2010.



AYCOCK

Wyatt Aycock earned a career-high 88.60, which is the highest all-around score of any current Husker. Aycock had five other career highs in the meet -- pommel horse (14.50), rings (14.20), vault (16.00), parallel bars (15.10) and high bar (14.40). Aycock also notched a 14.40 on floor. His vault of 16.00 is the highest score by any Husker on any event

this season.

Andreas Hofer led the Husker floor team with a 14.90, paving the way to his second place finish just ahead of teammate Will Eastman's 14.80.

Freshman Eric Schryver notched a career high 15.50 on pommel horse which gave him his third pommel horse title of the season. Five of six Huskers earned career highs on pommel horse Saturday. Those Huskers were David Jacobs (14.60), freshman C.J. Schaaf (13.50), Andrew House (14.20), Wyatt Aycock (14.50), and Eric Schryver (15.50). The Huskers 58.80 was an 8.5-point improvement from last week's meet at Ohio State.

Anthony Ingrelli tallied a season high 15.40 on rings, giving him a fifth event title of the season. Ingrelli's score was just one-tenth shy of his career high.

Next the Huskers moved to vault where Aycock tallied the highest Nebraska individual score of the season on any event with a 16.00. With that score, Aycock took second in the event.

Aycock also took home the parallel bars event title with his career-high 15.10. Hofer had a season-high 14.50 in his tie with teammate Mark Ringle. Both Ringle (14.50) and Jacobs (14.20) earned career highs on parallel bars Saturday.

On the final event of the night the Huskers moved to high bar, where freshman Micah Christensen's career-high 14.50 was the highest high bar score of the night for Nebraska.

**U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY**

Highlighted by a new team total and freshman Colton Wulf's Academy-record on the floor exercise, the 10th-ranked Air Force men's gymnastics team wrapped up the regular season with an impressive showing on Sunday, March 20, at the Academy's Cadet West Gym. The Falcons set three event records, en route to a program-best team score of 347.50, against an undermanned University of Washington Club team.

Wulf scored a 15.40 to win the floor exercise and move into first on the program's all-time list. The freshman, who also improved his all-around score to 86.50 to win the combined event competition, became just the second Air Force gymnast to crack the 15-point

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mark on the floor exercise.

In addition to setting the new overall team score in their dual meet with a partial squad from Washington, the Falcons also set Academy records on the floor (59.60), rings (59.40) and parallel bars (57.10).

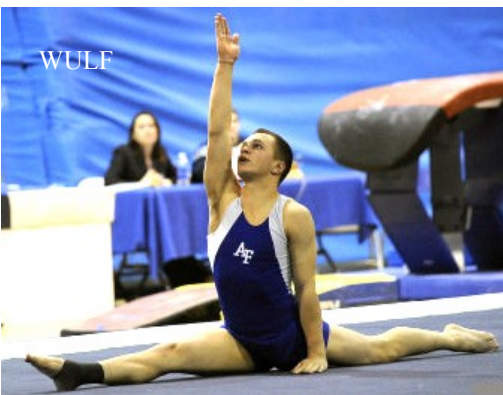
Nash Mills accounted for three first-place finishes on the day, including a career-best 15.30 on the still rings. That score - a personal improvement for Mills by a half-point - is the ninth-best score in Academy history. Mills also finished first on the parallel bars (14.40) and high bar (14.00).

Nick Owen won his second consecutive pommel horse title, taking first with a score of 14.20. Ben Zaiser scored a career-best matching 15.60 win the vault.

Tory Brown and Aaron Zaiser placed second (14.90) and third (14.80), respectively, on the floor exercise, while Dan Klimkowski and Wulf placed second and third on the pom-

mel horse. Klimkowski tallied a season-high score of 14.00, while Wulf improved his career score to 13.60. Klimkowski also placed second on the still rings with a season-high 14.80 and freshman Tyler Huebner improved his personal mark on that event to 14.70 to take third.

The Zaiser brothers claimed the top-two

finishes on the vault, as Aaron placed second to Ben with a season-high 15.30. Mills scored a 15.20 to finish third on that event. Brown picked up a second-place tally on the parallel bars behind a career-best 14.30, while Wulf and Matt Thorne tied for third with matching marks of 14.20. Wulf was the runner-up on the high bar with a 13.90, while James Okamoto scored a 13.80 to finish third.
